

AUDIO TRANSCRIPTION

Date of Recording April 1, 2022

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(1) MR. FABOZZI: Hello?

(2) OFFICER SWEELY: Hello, is this
(3) Mr. Joe Fabozzi?

(4) MR. FABOZZI: Yes, who's this?

(5) OFFICER SWEELY: Hi, this is
(6) Officer Dave Sweely. I am with the Mount Laurel
(7) Police Department.

(8) MR. FABOZZI: Yeah, can you hold
(9) on one second?

(10) OFFICER SWEELY: Sure.

(11) MR. FABOZZI: Hello, Officer
(12) Sweely, what can I do for you?

(13) OFFICER SWEELY: Hi, good
(14) morning. So I am a School Resource Officer here
(15) in Mount Laurel --

(16) MR. FABOZZI: Oh, good --

(17) OFFICER SWEELY: -- and the
(18) principal -- of the school, the principal of
(19) Hillside School contacted me this morning in
(20) regard to a voice message that you left for them,
(21) left for her?

(22) MR. FABOZZI: Yes, I have it
(23) recorded. Did you get to hear it?

(24) OFFICER SWEELY: Yes, I did. I
(25) heard it.

(1) MR. FABOZZI: Alright.

(2) OFFICER SWEELY: And I know they
(3) have also forwarded me, I guess prior emails that
(4) you have been in communications with the members
(5) of the PTO for that school.

(6) So your -- your phone call
(7) today, which was vulgar in nature was alarming
(8) and concerning to the principal and the
(9) superintendent and they asked that I contact you
(10) and advise you that you are to cease and desist
(11) any and all communications with the school and
(12) the PTO, and if you continue to have anymore
(13) communication with them, then they -- they may
(14) pursue a criminal complaint against you.

(15) MR. FABOZZI: The word fuck
(16) isn't really --

(17) OFFICER SWEELY: So -- well,
(18) anybody --

(19) MR. FABOZZI: (Inaudible).

(20) OFFICER SWEELY: Yeah, I think
(21) you were --

(22) MR. FABOZZI: How do I pursue my
(23) OPRA request then?

(24) OFFICER SWEELY: The OPRA can
(25) only -- the OPRA request would have to go through

(1) a government agency when a report --

(2) MR. FABOZZI: The school board?
(3) Not the school board? Is the school board?

(4) OFFICER SWEELY: No, no, it
(5) would have to be a law enforcement agency, a
(6) government type agency. So I mean --

(7) MR. FABOZZI: So how do I get
(8) the -- (inaudible) for my tort?

(9) OFFICER SWEELY: I don't know.
(10) Maybe you can speak to a counsel that can provide
(11) you information on how -- how you would get the
(12) information that you are looking for, maybe he
(13) can give you some legal advice on how to go about
(14) filing a lawsuit against them if you like.

(15) MR. FABOZZI: How come you
(16) aren't investigating the mother who falsely
(17) accused me of child molestation? I mean --

(18) OFFICER SWEELY: Well, because
(19) that matter was referred to the DCPMP initially
(20) --

(21) MR. FABOZZI: Because that was
(22) --

(23) OFFICER SWEELY: -- initially
(24) when that matter was reported to the school, the
(25) school is required, when they hear a possible

(1) allegation of child abuse, they are required to
(2) report the matter to Child Protective Services
(3) and then that information gets investigated by
(4) DCPMP and they are the investigating agency on
(5) those initial complaints. So if there would have
(6) been --

(7) MR. FABOZZI: So what about
(8) child abuse, you don't investigate child abuse?

(9) OFFICER SWEELY: Yes, we do when
(10) it's reported to us.

(11) MR. FABOZZI: Okay. I am
(12) reporting to you right now that Jennifer told
(13) that little girl to lie and say I finger banged
(14) her and I didn't, you already know that, that's
(15) child abuse. You can't teach a little girl about
(16) finger banging.

(17) OFFICER SWEELY: Okay. I don't
(18) know whether or not that's the case or not.

(19) MR. FABOZZI: So will you
(20) investigate? No, no, no, I know -- I just
(21) informed you of a crime, are you going to
(22) investigate it?

(23) OFFICER SWEELY: No, I am not
(24) going to investigate that.

(25) MR. FABOZZI: Yeah, I believe

(1) you are discriminating against me because I am a
(2) white male, because if this is a Puerto Rican
(3) female like Jennifer Olland, you would do all the
(4) investigating.

(5) OFFICER SWEELY: Not true, not
(6) true, I mean if you want to come to our police
(7) headquarters --

(8) MR. FABOZZI: Then why aren't
(9) you investigating, I just reported to a crime,
(10) why aren't you investigating it?

(11) OFFICER SWEELY: That she made a
(12) false report? Is that what you are asking me to
(13) investigate?

(14) MR. FABOZZI: Yes, she made a
(15) false -- 28-3 unsworn false statement to
(16) authorities.

(17) OFFICER SWEELY: How do you have
(18) proof that she made that statement?

(19) MR. FABOZZI: Oh, I have the
(20) OPRA request from Waretown and Terrence Campbell
(21) -- I have the video, Terrence Campbell of DCPMP
(22) admits it on the video.

(23) OFFICER SWEELY: Okay. And --

(24) MR. FABOZZI: So it's Jennifer
(25) -- (inaudible).

(1) OFFICER SWEELY: Okay. And I
(2) understand that you have already filed a
(3) complaint in this matter, a citizen complaint in
(4) Waretown so that matter is currently under review
(5) as far as her filing a false police report.

(6) MR. FABOZZI: Now, there is
(7) confusion on that because we don't know where she
(8) filed it and nobody will tell me, and the court
(9) clerk in Waretown what did they say to me, I have
(10) to find that out. Did she make the claim in
(11) Mount Laurel, did she make the claim in
(12) Manahawkin, I am fairly sure she did not make the
(13) complaint in Waretown.

(14) OFFICER SWEELY: Yeah, I don't
(15) know anything about that, I just know that, you
(16) know, an allegation was reported to school staff,
(17) they did what they were supposed to do as far as
(18) calling Child Protective Services, Child
(19) Protective Services did their initial
(20) investigation, they made a determination it was
(21) unfounded so there is no reason for Child
(22) Protective Services to contact the police
(23) department to do a further investigation, so
(24) that's where it's at, it stopped at that point.

(25) My main reasoning for calling

(1) you today is just to advise you to stop
(2) communication with the school because they no
(3) longer -- you don't have any business calling the
(4) school, you don't live here, you don't have a
(5) child in the school, you are not a guardian of a
(6) child in the school, and they don't want --

(7) MR. FABOZZI: Oh, my business is
(8) they falsely accused me of child molestation, one
(9) of the teachers put that child up to it. What is
(10) the school -- you tell me --

(11) OFFICER SWEELY: The school did
(12) not falsely accuse you. They received
(13) information from a child and they forwarded to
(14) the appropriate agency that they are required to
(15) do, they do that all the time. That's part of
(16) their responsibility.

(17) MR. FABOZZI: So how did it go
(18) from me giving the baby a piggyback ride on my
(19) back at Walmart to me finger banging her, like
(20) cause her dad, father, Joseph Dunnkosky told me
(21) that's what his mom told her to say. Where did
(22) that come from?

(23) OFFICER SWEELY: I have -- I
(24) have no idea.

(25) MR. FABOZZI: I deserve an

(1) answer. Like I think your cease and desist is
(2) really weak here, you are discriminating against
(3) me because I am a white male.

(4) OFFICER SWEELY: Not true, I am
(5) just telling you --

(6) MR. FABOZZI: Yes, yes, true.
(7) If I was a Puerto Rican female you, would assist
(8) me. Look at all the assistance you gave Jennifer
(9) Olland, the Puerto Rican female, and all the
(10) females that work at the school. Giving me a
(11) cease and desist. How about they cease and
(12) desist of accusing me of child molestation?

(13) OFFICER SWEELY: I have not
(14) given any assistance to Ms. Olland, I have never
(15) spoken to her.

(16) MR. FABOZZI: Your department
(17) has. DCPMP and the school has.

(18) OFFICER SWEELY: Okay. And from
(19) this department, has anything --

(20) MR. FABOZZI: I think -- okay, I
(21) won't call them anymore, but I think their
(22) complaint, cease and desist call is really weak
(23) considering what they accused me of falsely, I
(24) could have spent the rest of my life in jail
(25) getting raped by people with AIDS for something I

(1) didn't do.

(2) OFFICER SWEELY: And DCPMP did
(3) their --

(4) MR. FABOZZI: So if I said fuck
(5) a couple of times --

(6) OFFICER SWEELY: Right, DCPMP
(7) did their investigation, they determined it to be
(8) unfounded, there is no reason for you to contact
(9) the school going forward. Okay?

(10) MR. FABOZZI: What is your name
(11) again, sir? I want to write it down.

(12) OFFICER SWEELY: Patrolman
(13) Sweely, S-W-E-E-L-Y.

(14) MR. FABOZZI: What is your badge
(15) number, sir?

(16) OFFICER SWEELY: 99.

(17) MR. FABOZZI: And are we in
(18) agreement that as long as I don't email the PTO
(19) or call the school, there will be no charges? Or
(20) are they going to charge --

(21) OFFICER SWEELY: If you don't do
(22) -- no, at this point they do not -- they do not
(23) want to charge you.

(24) MR. FABOZZI: So as of April 1
(25) --

(1) OFFICER SWEELY: As of April 1,
(2) 2022 10:39 a.m., that I am telling you that as
(3) long as you cease all communication with the
(4) school, you don't show up at any events --

(5) MR. FABOZZI: I can't go to the
(6) school board meetings to complain about --

(7) OFFICER SWEELY: My
(8) understanding about --

(9) MR. FABOZZI: (Inaudible) --
(10) that's an event.

(11) OFFICER SWEELY: My
(12) understanding school board meetings are open to
(13) the public, so use your discretion there.

(14) MR. FABOZZI: Will you get back
(15) to me before -- well, will you please get back to
(16) me? I intend to go bring this up at the school
(17) board meeting. Am I allowed to do that because
(18) it's a public meeting --

(19) OFFICER SWEELY: I will let the
(20) superintendent --

(21) MR. FABOZZI: (Inaudible) --
(22) against me if I do that. Let them know.

(23) OFFICER SWEELY: I will let them
(24) know. I don't know what his answer is going to
(25) be, it's my understanding that school board

(1) meetings are open to the public so --

(2) MR. FABOZZI: I'd like to come
(3) and voice my opinion about what happened.

(4) OFFICER SWEELY: Okay. Well,
(5) let me get a -- let me get a definitive answer
(6) for you whether or not you are allowed to go to
(7) an open school board meeting and I will get back
(8) to you.

(9) MR. FABOZZI: You heard the
(10) message, yeah, I didn't make any threats, I
(11) called him an f'ing disgrace.

(12) OFFICER SWEELY: Right, and did
(13) you hear what I said?

(14) MR. FABOZZI: (Inaudible).

(15) OFFICER SWEELY: Your -- your
(16) voice message left to the principal in her mind
(17) and the superintendent's mind was alarming and
(18) concerning to them in nature, so that's why they
(19) --

(20) MR. FABOZZI: Was it alarming
(21) and concerning to you, sir?

(22) OFFICER SWEELY: That's why it
(23) was -- that's why they asked me to communicate
(24) with you. I am not giving you my opinion.

(25) MR. FABOZZI: But you deal with

(1) bad guys who are dangerous all the time, was it
(2) alarming and concerning to you --

(3) OFFICER SWEELY: I am not giving
(4) -- I am not -- I am not giving you my opinion on
(5) this, alright?

(6) MR. FABOZZI: Yes, sir.

(7) OFFICER SWEELY: I am relaying a
(8) message they asked to be related to you and
(9) sounds to me like you comprehended it and there
(10) is nothing else we need to do.

(11) MR. FABOZZI: Oh, I do.

(12) OFFICER SWEELY: Okay.

(13) MR. FABOZZI: And you will get
(14) back to me on whether or not I can attend the
(15) school board meetings, please?

(16) OFFICER SWEELY: Yes, I will --
(17) I am going to call the superintendent right now,
(18) if he's available to speak to me and I will call
(19) you right back.

(20) MR. FABOZZI: Thank you and
(21) good-bye, yes.

(22) (Whereupon, the recording is
(23) terminated.)
